

## PHRASES EXPRESSING LIKE AND DISLIKE

### LIKE

#### 1. I'm into it:

When you are interested in an activity

**Example:** I'm into football these days.

#### 2. I'm keen on it :

You are interested in something and want to learn more about it.

**Example:** Gulnoza is keen on learning English.

#### 3. I'm fond of it :

You have liked of something for a long time or may have an emotional attachment with something.

**Example:** Fayoz is very fond of his old dog.

#### 4. It appeals to me:

It sounds good

**Example:** Football appeals to me.

#### 5. It goes down well :

Other people like something you do

**Example:** Speaking lesson goes down well to candidates.

#### 6. It's to my liking :

A very formal way to say "I like"

**Example:** Bounty is to my liking. It's perfect

#### 7. I'm partial to :

You like something a bit too much and it always remains your preference.

**Example:** I'm so tired though I'm partial to watch football game at 1.am

#### 8. I'm crazy/mad/passionate about :

You extremely love something

**Example:** Fayoz is crazy about Rock music.

#### 9. I'm attached to:

You don't want to do without something and you'd be sad if you lost it.

**Example:** I'm attached to my mobile phone. I always have it with me.

#### 10. I'm addicted to :

You like something so much that you can't Contain yourself from it(usually used for negative habits)

**Example:** I'm addicted to sleep late

### **11. I've grown to like it:**

Something you never liked before but you have developed a liking for it over a period of time.

**Example:** I've grown to like eating cake.

### **12. I can't get enough it:**

How much ever you like something, it is not enough.

**Example:** Sitara can't get enough eating an ice-cream.

### **13. I've got a soft spot:**

You like someone a little more than other people

**Example:** I've got a soft spot for my nephew.

### **14. I fancy him/her**

You think someone is attractive /good looking

**Example:** I fancy my girlfriend. She finds her extremely good looking.

## **DISLIKE**

### **1. I dislike it.**

This is a formal way of saying "I don't like it". It is very direct and could cause offense to some people.

**Example:** I dislike eating sushi.

### **2. I'm not into it :**

Saying you are not into something is an informal way of saying that you don't find it interesting.

**Example:** My brother is not into football. He likes rugby

### **3. I'm not fond of it.**

Not to be fond of something is informal for saying you don't like it very much

**Example:** Since Fayoz the accident, he's not very fond of going skiing

### **4. I'm not crazy about it.**

This expression is similar to "not be found of something"

**Example:** I'm not crazy about playing PUBG.

### **5. I don't appreciate that**

This way of expressing dislike is great for professional and serious conversations.

**Example:** I don't appreciate being shouted at in public.

### **6. It doesn't tickle my fancy**

It is an idiom and it means we did not find it appealing, funny or interesting

**Example:** That comedian's sense of humor doesn't tickle their fancy.

### **7. I'm disinterested in that.**

We use this sentence if something simply doesn't interest us.

**Example:** I'm disinterested taking photos in phone.

### 8. It's not for me.

This is a neutral way of explaining that you are not interested in something

**Example:** Most people love the series but it's not for me.

### 9. I'm not a big fan of it.

To say "I'm not a big fan" is an idiomatic expression and it means we do not like something very much

**Example:** I'm not a big fan of "Real Madrid".

### 10. I'll pass

This is a quick way of saying we are not interested in a suggestion.

**Example:** Do you want to come to the pub? No thanks. I'll pass.
